- KNSCN is a capacity-building and strengthening effort for the creation, development, and consolidation of community networks in Kenya.
- It is part of the project "Supporting Community-led Approaches to Addressing the Digital Divide" implemented in Brazil, Indonesia, Kenya, Nigeria, and South Africa by the Association for Progressive Communications (APC) in partnership with Rhizomatica, and with financial support from the UK Government's Digital Access Programme.
- It **aims** at equipping participants with the relevant knowledge and skills to run local, community-based Community Networks, with expert assistance where required.
